

We held a non-uniform day on the 1 February to help raise money for paper, pencils, schoolbags, clothes and especially underwear. Mrs Heare was staggered by the response—£1 000 raised in one day by the parents, pupils and staff of Hart Memorial Primary School. One of Mrs 🥻 Heare's pupils was so touched by how little these disadvantaged children have in the school in which Mrs Heare will be working, that she decided she would help by selling some toys that she no longer uses along with her friend from St John the Baptist Primary School. Sophia raised an amazing £80.40 by using her own initiative. Mrs Heare is overwhelmed by the support and donations she has received from everyone and will be showing us photographs of her time in Myanmar and telling us how the money was spent on her return.
