P7 pupils attended a workshop where they recapped the different forms of bullying and discussed the layered impacts that bullying can have on an individual. Our pupils recognise physical, verbal, nonverbal, emotional and cyber bullying and are aware of how this can impact on the mental health of the victim. Change starts with us!

# HART LEADS THE WAY WITH KILLER K!

In recent years we have really embraced the Golden Mile concept of the Healthy Kidz programme. This is where our classes walk / jog / run for 10 minutes, 3 times per week. Hundreds of children have been rewarded in recent years for their ability to complete 1 mile inside 10 minutes. The model of practice taking place in Hart Memorial has been recognised by Healthy Kidz as the number 1 in the 100+ schools where this organisation delivers. This year, a specialist running coach has been assigned to the school on Fridays to 'run' the classes through their 'Killer K', which is the challenge the children have been set this term: to see how quickly it takes each child to complete 1km. Further support has been given by Statsports, who have provided all children with one of their state-of-the-art vests & GPS trackers, providing accurate timings for every child. The level of effort that all classes have been putting into this initiative must be commended. The intention is that each child will present as fitter, healthier and more alert for learning.
